### Proposed Changes to Travel Assistance Policy - Children and Young People's Travel Service

Children and Young People's Travel Service, part of Birmingham City Council want to hear your thoughts on the proposed changes to the Travel Assistance Policy.

Birmingham City Council is undertaking a review of its Travel Assistance Policy and as part of this review they want to consult with students, parents, carers, and all other stakeholders on the changes to the policy that are being considered. These changes would come into effect for the 2024/25 academic year (September 2024 onwards).

The Children & Young People's Travel Service will be hosting webinars for parents and carers on Thursday 15th February at 10.30am and on Thursday 7th March at 5.30pm, so that representatives from the service can explain the proposed policy changes and talk through the Council's consultation process.

### Impact Pathways West Midlands

Impact Pathways is a 'map' of provision designed to help people who live and work in the West Midlands access support they might need. It allows the public and professionals to search in their area for the resource, knowledge and expertise of statutory agencies such as the NHS, private companies, together with a whole range of charities and community groups who exist to offer services to support people. The agencies are arranged by 'pathways' and postcode.

The nine pathways are:

- Drugs
- Alcohol
- Accommodation
- Children and families
- Finance, benefit and debt
- Mental and physical health
- Attitudes, thinking and behaviour
- Education, training and employment
- Domestic abuse, sexual abuse and sex work





### FREE Ikon Gallery Event



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


